

## WHAT IS THE TRINITY?

- "Trinity" is a word (not in the Bible) used to describe a biblical truth that God is three divine Persons—the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—yet one God.
- 2. The divine Persons act as a perfect unity, and they are indivisible. (The word for "one" in Deuteronomy 6:4 is a compound unity.)
- 3. The divine Persons share one divine Nature and will. They are coequal, distinguishable, but inseparable. He 1:3

## WHAT BIBLE TEXTS SHOW US THE TRINITY?

- 1. In Genesis 1:26-27, God speaks of Himself in the plural.
- 2. Matthew 28:19-20 expresses the Trinity as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- 3. The Trinity is seen at Jesus' water baptism in Lk 3:21-22.
- 4. The Father is called God. Is 63:16; Jn 6:27, 8:41; Re 4:8-11, 15:3-4
- 5. Jesus is called God or deity. (See Bible Truths and Quicklinks The Deity of Christ.)
- 6. The Holy Spirit is called God. Ac 5:3-4; 1 Co 2:10; 12:4-6; 2 Co 3:18; He 9:14; 1 Jn 2:27

## WHAT DOES THE TRINITY MEAN FOR US?

The doctrine of the Trinity distinguishes Christianity from all other cults and world religions. Because God is a Trinity, He values:

- 1. Loving relationship and community. De 6:4-9; 1 Co 8:6; 12:4-7
- 2. Unity and diversity. Jn 17:20-21; 1 Co 12:12-31
- 3. Missions. Mt 28:19; Jn 1:14
